

### Objective and Description:

The workshop, is a part of a cycle of international design experiences with the students, based on the idea of "Organic Design", where five European universities collaborate (from Italy to Germany, to Netherlands, Greece, and France). This year will be hosted in the magic spaces of the royal complex of San Leucio (Caserta), where is based "Officina Vanvitelli", a prestigious creative Lab of the University of Campania. Since 1997, the Belvedere of San Leucio is inscribed in the Unesco WHC Nomination.





The place is full of charm, where a powerful settlement designed by the Bourbons in the 18th century was intended to be a virtuous productive village, imagined as a perfect community for a perfect silk. It is a presidium of architecture in a theatrical landscape. Making the landscape as an act of theatre.

The village originally was outlined in a precise circular figure made by non-common geometries. The name "Ferdinandopoli" was in honour to the promoter, Ferdinando IV the Bourbon, king of Napoli. Instead of its monarchical origin, it is considered one of the earliest attempts of a socialist republic, where the life (with the housing complex), the work (with the mill integrated with the hill) and the place (the monumental architecture with the "belvedere") was a kind of ideal situation, a kind of realized utopia in a specific place, and in a site-specific architectural complex.

It was a project left into the imaginary because only a part of it finally was built. Today we can recognize an interrupted system of urban fragments, and some architectural pieces lost in the landscape of a really interesting topography.

This year, the topic of the workshop will focus on the idea of Architecture as a presence, not only in the landscape, or commonly integrated in the topography, but directly linked to the bigger scale of the geography.

We'll be hosted in a royal complex, and in a village that today, accidentally, is made by the fragments of a greater design symbolized with the medallion of an ideal city.

We will have the chance to interact, in terms of masses, volumes, geometries and positions, with new architectural elements, both in terms of new buildings, new functions, and landscape presences. A revisited plasticity made up to interact architectonically with the old and the actual, in the power of the horizon and the qualities of the site. The necessity of a systematic configuration of the functions and the program of the historical complex, needs today an updated study and new architectural interventions. The aim of this workshop is to offer to the Municipality an updated program for the historical heritage with new buildings (or integration and re-configuration of parts) and new housing related to the cultural and productive life of the complex, finally a better integration in the urban and regional context.

Successful participation will be accredited with 3 ECTS.


# Program / Calendar
